Staff, Pioneering Programs and Technology Expand in New, Larger NCRF Headquarters

Wall to wall, office to warehouse- the new home for the National Children's Reading Foundation is ideal for expanding its innovative programs across the country.

Nancy Kerr, NCRF president, said the new facilities at 515 W. Entiat Ave. in Kennewick, WA fulfill the Foundation's needs for both space and top technological support. "These advancements," she noted, "were made possible partly because of grants from the Washington Department of Early Learning and Thrive by Five WA and partly because of the growing awareness of our important mission."

The 2,000 square-foot office suite and 6,000 square-foot warehouse is now the base of operations for both the Foundation and its growing *READY! For Kindergarten* division.

The bright, high-ceilinged warehouse is organized with NCRF materials and arranged with an assembly line to allow quick turnaround for orders from Foundation chapters and participating schools.

New Headquarters...

In the office, Dianna Lopez, Office and Operations Manager, handles the day to day financial aspects of *READY!* such as purchasing and invoicing orders, and in the warehouse, Manager Bobby Paine oversees the assembly and disbursement of program resources.

Seventy-five schools and districts from Kennewick to New Mexico and Illinois to Canada use the Foundation's school readiness materials. More orders are coming in for the winter and springs terms.

Parents receive tools and training through *READY!* to help them prepare their children for school and have fun doing it. NCRF provides the materials, PowerPoint lesson plans and projects for local groups. The *READY! for Kindergarten* web site is being updated and will be operational soon.

NCRF: A Decade of Commitment

For a decade the National Children's Reading Foundation has helped communities make boys and girls enthusiastic, strong readers. Affiliate foundations in more than a dozen states enjoy a close, supporting tie with NCRD while responding to the particular needs and opportunities of their home regions.

All of these reading foundations reach out to parents and childcare providers with information, resources, activities and encouragement. Their goal – to promote early literacy – is also the essential building block needed by all children to attain a good education and success in life.

The guiding board of each community-based Foundation chooses among these many NCRF programs and activities:

- **Books for Babies:** At hospitals parents are given baby's first book, a "Read to Me" bib, a brochure on reading to their baby, library card application, and a message from their school district.
- **Books to Grow On:** At pediatrician offices, children up to 4 years old receive a book and a prescription to read 20 minutes a day.

- **Well Fed, Well Read:** At area food banks and meal centers, young children select a new book. Parents receive book markers with read aloud tips.

- **Home Health Nurses/Home Visitors/Foster Care Families:** During each home visit a new book and parent education is offered.

- **Sunshine Shelves:** Bright yellow book shelves are stocked with gently used books in targeted apartment offices and employee lunch rooms. Parents may take books home to read with their children. Books are returned for other titles.

- **Booker T. Bear:** NCRF's mascot, a yellow bear with a *20 minutes a day* t-shirt, is available for school visits and other events.

- **Story Van:** Books are read aloud, plus activities, at housing developments, farms, day

cares, and community events.

- **Read Around the House:** Children color a drawing of a two-story house and yard as they read in various locations. Pictures are displayed at the library.

- **Dads and Doughnuts - Moms and Muffins:** Short and popular gatherings at schools, parks and community sites, at which books are read and snacks are shared.

- **First Teacher Libraries:** New elementary teachers receive 100 children's books for their classroom.

- **Storybook Santa:** At malls elves read books to children and Santa gives children books rather than candy.

- **Breakfast with Santa:** Service clubs sponsor a warm breakfast for low-income children, where they listen to the *Polar Express*, sing, get a new book and hug Santa.
